Ignazio Silone novels translated in arabic

Ignazio Silonés collection of novels Voyage in Paris has been translated in Arabic for the first time and will be published by the Language Department at the University of Baghdad. Ironically, the academics from Baghdad's university have chosen the works of Silone, who was one of the founders of the Italian Communist Party which he left in 1930 for his opposition to Stalin's politics, as a periphrasis of the complex social and political situation in the country after the fall of Saddam Hussein's regime. The translation also pays homage to Italy and the region of Abruzzo where Silone was born on May 1, 1900.

The cultural exchange between Abruzzo and Iraq has lasted for years and even now the "Help Them Live" association from the village of Spoltore continues to send humanitarian aid to the Asian state. This commitment made volunteers from the Abruzzo region collect funds for the reconstruction of the library of Baghdad's Academy of Fine Arts as well as for the creation of an Italian section at the Language Department dedicated to Silone.
